

RECORD RESULTS FOR DERBY'S PRIMARY CHILDREN



Derby's children have achieved record outcomes in their Year 6 SAT tests. The percentage of children attaining at least a Level 4 qualification in Reading, Writing and Mathematics has improved to 77% of pupils, an increase of 5 percentage points compared to 2013.

The results have shown some schools have made a significant improvement.

In particular Allenton which increased by 36 percentage points;

Ravensdale Junior, St Joseph's Primary and St Peters Junior also recorded good improvements compared to 2013.

At Parkview Primary 100% of children achieved level 4+ reading, writing and mathematics.

The Government tests are the most demanding that they have ever been and this year's results means that more children than ever are achieving national expectations in reading, writing and mathematics.

Councillor Fareed Hussain, Cabinet Member for Children and Young People, said,

"I would like to congratulate all Derby schools on these very good results which demonstrate

the hard work of pupils, teachers, head teachers, governors and parents.
